Fruitful reflection at Norwood Care Home Messy Vintage Church this week.

One of Henry Purcell's best-known compositions is a choral piece that earned the nickname The Bell Anthem because its introduction sounds like pealing bells. The words to it are taken from the letter St Paul wrote from prison to the persecuted first century church in the Roman colony of Philippi which we will hear read at our 10.00 Harvest Festival service on Sunday.

"Rejoice in the Lord always" Paul tells his readers down the centuries but how can we do that today after watching the news on TV or if we're struggling with health, financial or relationship problems? The answer lies in Paul's words that follow this exhortation; he says: "the Lord is near; in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God".

Yesterday's prayer in our monthly church Prayer Diary comprised these wise words from Christian writer, C.S.Lewis: "God cannot give us peace and happiness apart from Himself because there is no such thing. Life with God is not immunity from difficulties, but peace within difficulties".

The Philippians bible reading we will hear read at our Harvest Festival on Sunday ends with 8 short words: "the God of peace will be with you" which enable us to "rejoice in the Lord always". May you discover this truth afresh in this season of mellow fruitfulness.

Growing Greener

Green Tip of the week

As nights draw in and temperatures drop, this may be a good time to be thinking about how you might heat your home in the future. Gas and oil are increasingly unsatisfactory options as both emit greenhouse gases. Wood burning stoves, while carbon neutral in one respect, may involve a lot of carbon in transporting the logs to your home. They also pollute the air with particulates that are not good for your health.

Heat pumps may be an answer (air or ground sourced). They are not a cheap option, but the long winter months may be a good time to investigate this method of heating.

Revd Sarah adds:

Perhaps like me, you do not live in a house that you own and as such, have no control over the type of boiler - if its effective and efficient... or indeed, if it's even working. However, we can control the thermostat... and the way in which we use heating. There is no draught excluder behind my letterbox - I must fix that this year as I'm sure there's a lot of heat loss through it. And in the gap under the backdoor through which I can see daylight and a broken draught excluder. Ask me (and Adam!) in a couple of weeks if we've done anything about it!



The life and mission of St Margaret's is financially sustained through generous giving. If you have been giving regularly as part of your practice of gratefully living in God's service, thank you. If you're new to the community, or would like to think about celebrating life in this way, you may find the following helpful: we receive no income from 'The Church'... we are the church! So, thank you – for anything and everything that you are able to give in response to God's generosity.

In church you can give in a couple of ways on the day:

- Collection plate during services a collection plate is sometimes passed among the congregation, but you will more often find it at the South door as you leave or arrive. Do use a yellow envelope if you're a tax payer so gift aid may be re-claimed.
- Tap giving during services a tap giving machine is located on the pillar on the west wall, to the left of the bell tower do consider tapping your card or device. As well as giving regularly, this is also a good way of offering an occasional additional gift.
- **Regular Giving** St Margaret's is registered with the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>, allowing you to be in control of your giving and to give securely and safely online by Direct Debit.
- Online giving If you wish to make a one-off or extra gift online, you can do so securely via the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>.
- **Gift Aid** if you are a tax payer, St Margaret's can claim back the basic tax you have already paid to the government. To make the appropriate declarations, please speak with the treasurer, John Grierson.
- Leaving a **gift in your will** or making a **donation in memory** of a loved one no matter how large or small, every gift makes a difference. If you would like to talk about this with someone, in confidence, then please consider speaking with the treasurer, <u>John Grierson</u> or the Vicar, <u>Sarah</u>.
