How are you called to serve God and neighbour?

As Revd Helen is ordained Priest this afternoon (2.30pm at St Edmundsbury Cathedral - all welcome, or

join online here

) we see how faith is lived out, not just in the words that are spoken prayerfully in church on Sundays, or through the songs we sing, but in action. James 2:17 reminds us that faith without works, is dead. We rejoice with Revd Helen, though we recognise that not all are called to ordained ministry. But we are all called to an active ministry in God's service. Active ministry may take different forms - how do you currently serve God and God's church?

I have recently been approached about the possibility a 'drop-in café' in the church over the summer months and into September. Others have wondered about a space for those who are creative, to bring their current projects, or to work on projects that might benefit the church or wider community - a variation of a prayerful, faithful 'knit and natter' group, of sorts. These conversations make me wonder how the Holy Spirit is working among us - stirring us up, perhaps?

The Holy Spirit often disrupts in us life's comforts and comforts in us life's disruptions. If you are a little too comfortable - beware! The Holy Spirit may be at work, calling you to commit to something new. Dare you echo the words of Mary as you leave the past behind and say 'Yes Lord'... 'let it be to me according to your word'?

And if you've said 'Yes, Lord' already... and recently followed God's invitation in a way that is disrupted life as you have known it, may God use your disruption to help others find faith and hope and love.

During the ordination service, ordinands are reminded of these words:

"You cannot bear the weight of this calling in your own strength, but only by the grace and power of God. Pray therefore that your heart may daily be enlarged and your understanding of the Scriptures enlightened.

Pray earnestly for the gift of the Holy Spirit."

As you pray these words for Revd Helen as she faithfully gives up what has been and commits to God's call on her life, pray them for yourself too. What do you think God is calling you to commit to... and in what way will that call build up the whole community here at St Margaret's? Do let me know!

A highly experienced Bishop has been chosen to lead the Church of England in Suffolk, as Downing Street announced her appointment yesterday. The Rt Revd Dr Joanne Grenfell, 53, has been Bishop of Stepney, an area bishop in the Diocese of London, since 2019. She is also the lead Bishop for safeguarding in the Church of England nationally and has now been appointed the new diocesan bishop for Suffolk.

Bishop Joanne succeeds the Rt Revd Martin Seeley who retired after 10 years in the county earlier this year and who was recently awarded the Suffolk Medal for his commitment to the county, leading with wisdom and humility.

Married with three children, Bishop Joanne will be the first woman to lead the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich. For more information please click here

The life and mission of St Margaret's is financially sustained through generous giving. If you have been giving regularly as part of your practice of gratefully living in God's service, thank you. If you're new to the community, or would like to think about celebrating life in this way, you may find the following helpful: we receive no income from 'The Church'... we are the church! So, thank you – for anything and everything that you are able to give in response to God's generosity.

In church you can give in a couple of ways on the day:

Collection plate

- during services a collection plate is sometimes passed among the congregation, but you will more often find it at the South door as you leave or arrive. Do use a yellow envelope if you're a tax payer so gift aid may be re-claimed.

• Tap giving

- during services a tap giving machine is located on the pillar on the west wall, to the left of the bell tower - do consider tapping your card or device. As well as giving regularly, this is also a good way of offering an occasional additional gift.

- Regular Giving– St Margaret's is registered with the Parish Giving Scheme
- , allowing you to be in control of your giving and to give securely and safely online by Direct Debit.
- **Online giving** If you wish to make a one-off or extra gift online, you can do so securely via the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>.
- Gift Aid

 – if you are a tax payer, St Margaret's can claim back the basic tax you have already paid to the government. To make the appropriate declarations, please speak with the treasurer, John Grierson.
