Resurrection doesn't always look like an empty tomb.

Nor is resurrection a return to the life we once new.Resurrection is about life transformed. Sometimes resurrection looks like *people changing their minds*.

That's what happens in this week's reading in Acts.

Peter returns from a boundary-breaking encounter and has to explain himself. No longer is he preaching the old ways. No longer is he telling the story of how things have always been. He doesn't argue theology or ecclesiology.

Instead, he tells a story - of visions, strangers, and the Spirit moving in ways that no one expected. Perhaps in ways that some never wanted but ways instead, that make room for God's abundant love and life among all peoples.

And by the end, the people who questioned him say something that still echoes today: "Then God has given even to them the repentance that leads to life."

Even to them. Even to us.

Let's pray this weekend for the promise of resurrection. For changed minds among world leaders who wage war. For changed minds among this church community and a willingness for more people to offer to stand and serve as PCC members. That instead of building walls that keep us apart we might instead build a bigger table that as we take up our place, loving and serving one another and sharing in resurrection life together.

The life and mission of St Margaret's is financially sustained through generous giving. If you have been giving regularly as part of your practice of gratefully living in God's service, thank you. If you're new to the community, or would like to think about celebrating life in this way, you may find the following helpful: we receive no income from 'The Church'... we are the church! So, thank you – for anything and everything that you are able to give in response to God's generosity.

In church you can give in a couple of ways on the day:

Collection plate

 during services a collection plate is sometimes passed among the congregation, but you will more often find it at the South door as you leave or arrive. Do use a yellow envelope if you're a tax payer so gift aid may be re-claimed.

Tap giving

- during services a tap giving machine is located on the pillar on the west wall, to the left of the bell tower do consider tapping your card or device. As well as giving regularly, this is also a good way of offering an occasional additional gift.
- Regular Giving— St Margaret's is registered with the <u>Parish Giving Scheme</u>, allowing you to be in control of your giving and to give securely and safely online by Direct Debit.
- Online giving— If you wish to make a one-off or extra gift online, you can do so securely via the Parish Giving Scheme.
- Gift Aid
 - if you are a tax payer, St Margaret's can claim back the basic tax you have already paid to the government. To make the appropriate declarations, please speak with the treasurer, John Grierson.
- Leaving agift in your willor making adonation in memory of a loved one no matter how large or small, every gift makes a difference. If you would like to talk about this with someone, in confidence, then please consider speaking with the treasurer, John Grierson or the Vicar, Sarah.
